### **COMMANDER'S CORNER**

June 14th is <u>Flag Day</u>, though begun by the <u>B.P.O.E.</u> (Elks), it holds special significance to us veterans and our loved ones. It SHOULD hold special meaning to our CITIZENRY, which has sworn allegiance to it.



There is an <u>etiquette</u> regarding our flag and it is even <u>codified</u>: Chapter 1 of Title 4 of the United States **Code** (4 U.S.C. § 1 et seq).

When flags are no longer serviceable, formal retirement ceremonies are conducted by our American Legion, Elks and Scouts of America . Flags are not to be taken out with the trash or flown in ragged condition.

American Flags are sold at <u>numerous locations</u>, including free flags and poles via <u>Flags of Honor</u>.

Flag Day gives us veterans the opportunity to show proper respect for <u>Old Glory</u> and to perhaps influence others to come forth and exhibit their pride in America and in our Republic's Flag.

Do you recall the lyrics of, "<u>It's a Grand Old Flag</u>"? I love that song and, yes, I still get a special feeling when I see our nation's Standard passing by on parade!

Some folks may become jaded regarding this annual holiday, but Flag Day should serve a reminder that our Nation is special and has endured, in great part, due to the protections afforded it by our service to America.

If you get the chance, attend a Flag Day ceremony and rejoice in the security that our sacrifices have made to ensure American liberties.

By the way, when reciting the pledge of allegiance, do you ever feel especially good when saying, "under God"? I do. God bless America!
