When creating important data on your computer, keep in mind that an "accident" may occur, causing it to become lost.

Consider saving your work, as you are creating it, and give successive savings a different name, so you can return to a previous version, if need be. You might add to the name, 1, 2, 3 or a, b, c, etc.

Save files before printing and save externally to a thumb drive or external hard drive, just for "insurance".

THE WOMEN'S ARLINGTON MEMORIAL

The Women's Memorial Arlington National Cemetery is a unique living memorial honoring all military women, past, present and future, is the only major National Memorial honoring women who served in our nation's defense during all eras and in all services. Eligibility as a member includes living or deceased women veterans, active-duty and Reserve Guard in United States Public Health Service, uniformed women, women in the Coast Guard Auxiliary, and in the Civil Air Patrol.

Eligibility as a we also served member includes women who served overseas during conflicts in direct support of the Armed Forces in organizations such as the Red Cross, USO, and special services. Those in the United States Public Health Service Cadet Nurse Corps are included in a special honor roll of cadet nurses.
