

COMMANDER'S CORNER

So far, the Internet is still relatively free. Yes, there is the obligatory cost for an ISP (Internet Service Provider), though some folks have figured ways to get around that cost.



Yes, there are times when it seems Internet speeds vary and that leads me to my main concern regarding access and speed.

Have you heard the term, network neutrality? On December 14, 2017, the FCC voted to repeal the strong net neutrality rules that were preserving an open, fair, and competitive internet for all users.

Without net neutrality rules in place, ISPs can prevent users from visiting some websites, provide slower speeds for services like Netflix and Hulu, or even redirect users from one website to a competing website. Net neutrality rules prevent this by requiring ISPs to connect users to all lawful content on the internet equally, without giving preferential treatment to certain sites or services.

Members of Congress can act to nullify the FCC's rollback of net neutrality by introducing and passing a resolution of disapproval as soon as the FCC's new Order has been both published in the Federal Register and sent to Congress in an official report. After that, members of Congress have 60 legislative days to introduce a resolution of disapproval that cannot be amended or blocked by filibuster.

Senator Edward Markey kicked off the process and <u>announced his plans</u> to introduce a CRA to counteract the FCC's actions. Nineteen senators have <u>come out in support of this plan</u>, including Senate Minority Leader Chuck Schumer, and that number is continuing to grow. Another CRA resolution was promised in the House of Representatives by Representative Mike Doyle. A CRA resolution would restore the rules codified by the <u>2015</u> Open Internet Order.

You can sit back or take action (contact Congress). How do you want it?

TAX INFORMATION

Under the new law, most people will see their taxes go down, how much your taxes go down depends on how much you earn, if you are married, how many kids you have, if you own a home, etc. I've done a few simple calculations to show potential savings:

- Single E-4, 3 years service: \$340 savings
- Married E-5, 6 years service, with 2 kids: \$1,350 savings
- Single O-2, 2 years service: \$2,000 savings
- Married O-5, 10 years service, with 2 kids: \$4,100 savings
- Married 50 year old veteran making \$110K with 2 kids and a mortgage: \$3,000 savings
- Single 50 year old veteran making \$60K with a mortgage: \$500 savings
- Married 65 year old veteran making \$50K with a mortgage: \$1,200 savings

So as you can see, most individuals will see rates go down, and those who make more money will see a bigger savings. Remember though, these tax cuts are scheduled to end in 7 years.
