## **ONLINE SHOPPING**

BEFORE you submit any payment information, make sure you're on a secure website. The URL (address) on the payment screen should have "https" instead of just "http." If you're shopping on a wireless network, make sure it's secure, and protected by a password.

Regarding payment methods, avoid using your checking account or debit card. If your account information or debit card is stolen, a hacker could wipe out all the money in your account.

A good thing about credit cards is that you are only liable for a maximum of \$50 for fraudulent charges. You may also be able to add extra security features on a credit card. For instance, some card issuers offer text message verifications. Immediately after a transaction happens, you'll receive a text message to allow you to confirm that it's legit, and not a fraud. Some credit card issuers have implemented two-factor authentication for online purchases. After you submit your payment information, you'll receive an email or text message with a one-time code. To complete the transaction, you'll enter that code on their website to confirm that it's really you making the purchase.

Ed has arranged for us to get together at 1:00 PM for a meeting and lunch (to include spouses) on January 21, 2016 at the Golden Corral at 163


